

Wood End Park Academy's Contingency Planning and Remote Learning Statement

The government has introduced a [tiered system of restrictions](#) to help pupils access face-to-face education for as long as possible in the event of local outbreaks.

The tiers below will **only** apply to the children if our school is in an area of [local restriction](#). Local and national authorities will decide which tier to implement.

If there is a local outbreak and we are asked to close temporarily for most pupils, (Tier 4) WEPA will provide remote teaching.

When teaching remotely, we will:

- Plan a programme that's of equivalent length to the core teaching pupils would receive in school, ideally including daily contact with teachers
- Set assignments so that pupils have work each day in a number of different subjects, and monitor pupils' engagement with these assignments
- Teach an age appropriate planned and sequenced curriculum so that knowledge and skills are built incrementally, with clarity about what's intended to be taught and practised in each subject
- Provide frequent explanations of new content, delivered by a teacher in your school or through curriculum resources and/or videos
- Gauge how well pupils are progressing through the curriculum, using questions and other suitable tasks, and set a clear expectation on how regularly teachers will check work
- Enable teachers to adjust the pace or difficulty of what's being taught in response to questions or assessments, including, where necessary, revising material or simplifying explanations to ensure pupils' understanding
- Avoid an over-reliance on long-term projects or internet research activities

3	We will remain open full-time for all pupils	<p>Continue to use the Operational Plan and Risk Assessment</p> <p>Home Learning will be provided to children who are self-isolating due to confirmed contact with a positive case</p> <p>Staff members self-isolating due to confirmed contact with a positive case will remotely teach their class</p>
4	<p>We will only remain open for vulnerable pupils and the children of critical workers.</p> <p>We will provide remote education for all other pupils.</p>	<p>WEPA will revert to home learning full time.</p> <p>All pupils will be able to access remote learning from home. We will have a programme that is equivalent in length to the core teaching pupils would receive in school, ideally including daily contact with teachers</p> <p>Pupils will access this through:</p> <p>EYFS: School Website and Tapestry</p> <p>Years 1 and 2 – School Website and Google Classroom</p> <p>Years 3 to 6 – School Website (non core subject work), Google Classroom and Athletics</p> <p>Those with no suitable access to IT</p> <p>Will be sent printed sheets and workbooks (if this is preferred); some families will be loaned IT equipment to use.</p> <p>Vulnerable Pupils</p> <p>Those on our vulnerable pupil list, including those with a child protection plan etc, we will encourage to continue attending school. To do this, we will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Work with our local authority and social care • Contact a pupil's parent or carer, and (where applicable) social worker if the pupil doesn't attend, to find out why and discuss their concerns <p>Free School Meals</p> <p>We will use a government voucher scheme for all pupils eligible for free schools meals, whether they are at home or on-site.</p> <p>Staffing</p>
