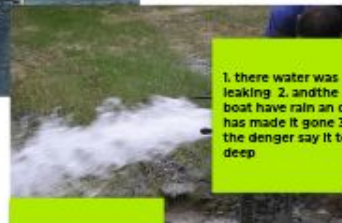

LQ: What is the chronology of British Monarchs since 1066?

Tudor

Henry VIII: 1509 - 1547 (38 years). Was ill at age 55, and died of the leg ulcers, which troubled him until his death in 1547 and was known to have heart failure and kidney failure.



Mary I: 1553 - 1558 (5 years). Since she was an illegitimate son of Henry VIII, she was pulled out of the heir of succession, and reinstated but pulled out by Edward VI again.



Edward VI: 1547 - 1553 (6 years). Also as a weak and child king, the others were using Regency to strengthen their positions in the heir to become the king.



Elizabeth I: 1558 - 1603 (45 years). Was succeeded to the throne at the end of Mary's death, as she was her half-sister, she took over the throne and ruled for 45 years.

Kesh

<p>What were common roles of women before the war?</p>	<p>There were many different kinds of common roles for women before the second world war started , such as : housewives, nursing, being a domestic servant, a shop assistant, or for those women who were not already married, they didn't have to do any jobs at that moment. However, if they didn't want to do those jobs then they could just stay at home, look after their children, and cook for them.</p>
<p>Why did more jobs become available for women?</p>	<p>The reason why there were lots of more jobs available for the rest of the women, that were not fighting, was because during the war many of the men and boys died. During world war two , if there were men who were fighting in the war and they died , then there would only be women left and all their jobs would be nursing or a housewife - then there might be more problems going on.</p>
<p>What common jobs did women have after the war?</p>	<p>After the war had ended (in 1945) , a lot of men had died so this was the perfect opportunity for the women to start and get a job. Women had multiple chances to become some of these roles : mechanics, engineers, Tank drivers, Building ships, Working in factories - making bombs and aircraft parts, Air raid workers, Driving fire engines, Plumbers, Ambulance drivers, Plumbers, WRVS volunteers, and nurses.</p>
<p>How did propaganda impact women's roles in the war?</p>	<p>Propaganda impacted some of the roles in the war because they would put up many different kinds of propaganda posters to inspire women to become better at something they wanted to do (eg : become a nurse, plumber).</p>
<p>Look at the sources of Queen Elizabeth; do you think she inspired women? How?</p>	<p>I think that she did inspire some women because during world war two, she trained to become a truck driver and for some women, they could choose to be a driver and she helped those women become better at it. She may have also helped some other women become better at another job as well. Queen Elizabeth II joined the army and it helped some of the other women to think about joining the army to also help out.</p>
