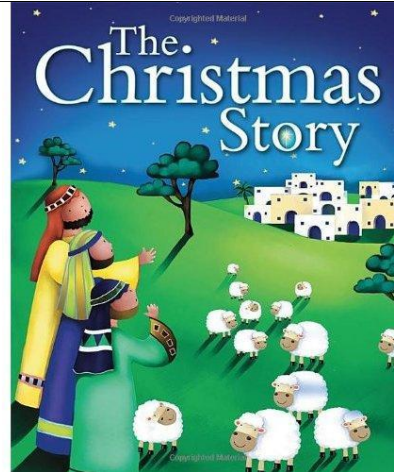
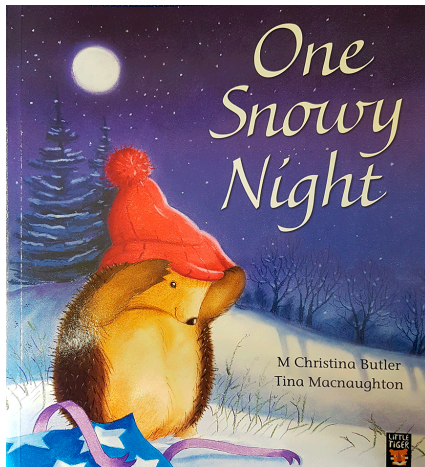


## What can you do at home?
