## CITIZENSHIP

Wood End Park Academy's very own Active Citizens of WEPA have been working hard this month to promote the profile on many things. These include rights of children, as well as taking part in many citizenship activities to care for, not only our school, but the local community as well. Meeting on Thursdays, children from Year 3 and Year 4 are working hard in tackling different issues and concerns within the school and the community around us. Pupils have met to discuss the growing concerns of issues such as the cost of living in our community and also looking within our school as to how we can confront and solve these situations. Children visited different classrooms, conducted surveys with different teachers, and even spoke to the premises team on what is needed to help our environment within Wood End Park Academy. All the research has now led to the first steps for us to tackle the issues at hand. Children have been doing things such as; regular checks within classrooms to ensure that electricity is being used appropriately, creating posters for information about how to recycle within our school, strategies and tips on how to reduce waste. ## Spelling at WEPA

Spelling simply means writing a word using the commonly accepted sequence of letters and symbols. Because

words tend to have one accepted spelling, learning how to spell words is an important skill for pupils to develop and

is fundamental to Reading and Writing - not to mention, proper spelling makes written work easier to read!

At our school, pupils use a 'Have a Go' book where they label each page with a letter of the alphabet. When they

have a difficult word to spell they wish to use in their writing, pupils have a go at sounding out that word in their

book for an adult to look at who guides on how it needs to be corrected. This encourages pupils to use their

phonics and other patterns learnt in spelling.

Let's look at a part of spelling now.

Prefixes: a group of letters that are only attached to the beginning of a root word.

Root word: a basic word that has no prefix or suffix.

One of the most common prefixes is un. This prefix is the most useful for spellers to learn because it appears

frequently and its meaning is easy to understand and remember. Un means not (unhappy = not happy) or the

reverse of, or opposite of (as in untie).

Let's see some more. Remember that the prefix un means not

Root word: able Meaning: To have the skill to do something un + able = unable

Example: She was unable to complete her homework.

Root word: aware Meaning: To know something un + aware = unaware

Example: He was unaware of the non-uniform day.

Root word: common Meaning: Something seen frequently un + common = uncommon


Example: It is uncommon to see peacocks in the park.

Root word: fair Meaning: Something that is equal un + fair = unfair

# Information

## How to learn times table

Times Tables may seem easy when you've already learned them but they drive fear into many children - and this in turn has a negative effect on learning. In this article, I'm going to look into learning times tables, help you identify your child's knowledge of them and provide some useful tips on how to help at home.

### Firstly, find out which tables they know and don't know

It makes sense to take stock of where your child is with tables before trying to help them. To do this simply log in to Times table rockstars (ask your child's class teacher if they have not received a log in) and look at the heat map. To do this, click on the avatar then 'my stats'. <https://play.ttrockstars.com/auth/school/student>

### What Order Should We Learn Times Tables In?

Start with the easy tables first - the Easy Times Tables are the 10x, 2x and 5x times tables.

### What are the Methods for Learning Tables?

- Stick to one times table at a time to minimise confusion
- Start with chanting and writing them out slowly in order
- Then move on to completing the answers quickly in order - on Times table rockstars, paper or verbally with your child
- Finally, move on to completing the answers in any order
- Keep reminding your child that  $3 \times 4$  is the same as  $4 \times 3$  - this effectively halves the number of tables facts
- Talk about the numbers if you encounter them " $3 \times 6 = 18$  that's our house number"

### What are the Tips and Tricks for Learning Each Times Tables

- The 2s, 4s and 8 times tables are doubles of each other - with many common answers -  $2 \times 8 = 16$ ,  $4 \times 4 = 16$ ,  $8 \times 2 = 16$
- The nine times tables can use the ten times tables and work back or compensate - so for  $5 \times 9$ , think  $(5 \times 10) - 5 = 50 - 5 = 45$ , also note that the digits in the answer always add to 9.
- The 3 and 6 times tables are tricky. Do the 3s first then the 6s - expect these to be more difficult and make an allowance in time
- The 7 times tables are hard but if you've done the other tables first you'll find you've encountered most of the 7s already elsewhere - such as  $7 \times 4 = 28$ ,  $7 \times 3 = 21$
- $7 \times 8 = 56$  is the hardest times table! - but tell this to your child and make a big deal about it and they'll never forget it!

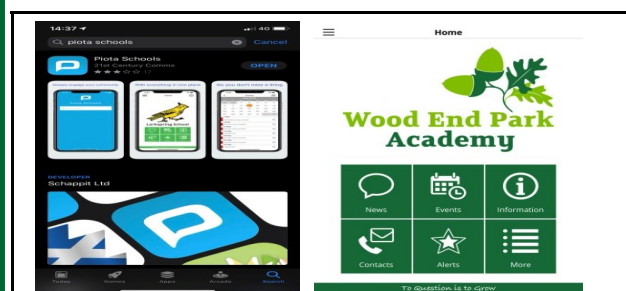
