Attendance

Each child should come to school every day to improve their learning and to help develop their life skills. In **year 4**, we expect 100% attendance from each child. This is especially important and last year we managed to raise our attendance by a significant amount. Each day the attendance is checked, and if any of the year 4 classes has had 100% for the week, then all the children in that class will be rewarded with a non school uniform day!

Accelerated Reader

All children have taken a 'Star Reader' test. This has given them a specific band range. This means that they should be reading books within this band. Books have been banded in school and you will see orange stickers on these books. You are also able to look up books at home using AR BookFinder:

These books are the correct difficulty level for your child to be reading in order to make progress in their reading ability. Once children have finished a book, they sit a quiz on it at school. You can see their progress at home too! This can be done by accessing home connect – link can be found on the school website under section 'Useful Links'.

Homework: Literacy and Numeracy homework is given out every Thursday and must be returned by Tuesday. Additionally, Google Classroom homework is closely monitored by all teachers and there is an expectation that all forms of homework are completed weekly by their due





Each child is expected to read for at least 10 minutes every single day. If your child has not read and their reading log is not signed daily then they will attend reading catch up.

Please support us and your child by ensuring the tasks above are completed so that the children enhance their learning and do not have to miss out on some of their play and reward times to complete them.


Uniform


What will my child be learning this term?

States of Matter

In Spring 1 for science, the children will be learning about the different states of matter and how things change between solids, liquids and gases. The children will be learning the properties of each and how things in our world can be classified. For example, your child will learn that to be a solid, the item they see must be able to maintain it's shape – such as a cup – and the tea inside changes shape based on the container it is in – making it a liquid!

The Tudors


