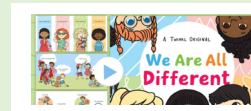




How you can help your child at home:

Literacy:

Reading is important part of introducing your child to new vocabulary: read some of the book opposite access them on YouTube or at your local Library.



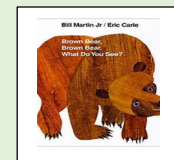
We will be reading the following books :

We Are Different: the book is a great resource to teach children about differences; they learn to talk about themselves and others in a positive respectful way. The book looks at different hair types ,different families and different likes and dislikes.

Owl Babies by Martin Waddle: this book is about three owlets who wake up one night to find that their mother has gone. They become worried about her absence and make up different stories about what could have happened. In the end, the mother returns. This book tackles anxieties and fears that young children have when they are temporarily separated from a parent.



Funny Bones by Janet and Allan Ahlberg : A big skeleton, a little skeleton and a dog skeleton. They live in a dark dark Cellar of a dark,dark house on a dark dark hill and so this word continues through this lighthearted story for early readers.

The fun repetitive story helps children to relate colour to objects and encourage language for children join to join in with.

All About Me

Children will be learning about themselves in a fun interactive way by answering their questions about why they are different from their peers.

This topic tells children why they are unique and different from each other and teaches them to respect these differences by celebrating them.

We will be learning about:

Our different families, Our different appearances Our different likes and dislikes

You can help by:

Bring in a picture of your family so we can display it.

Fill in the 'all about me' booklet with your child.

Talk about the differences between family members : eye colour, hair, who is taller?

Colour

Children will be learning about the primary colours and exploring what happen when they mix them. They will also be looking at colours in the environment outside. What colours are the leaves now? The grass? The children will find out what we can do to colour. How do we make this colour lighter, darker? Breaking down stereotypes e.g. girls like pink, boys blue.

You can help by:

Take a picture with your favourite colour and put it on tapestry.

Exploring Autumn

The children will be looking at how the weather has changed, how the outdoor environment has changes because it is autumn.

We will be researching the differences between Autumn, Winter, Spring and Summer. What animals are out in Autumn? What happens to the weather temperature? What clothes do we wear in Autumn?

You can help by:

Going for a nature walk : What did you find? Bring it in to nursery for our nature table! Can your child describe what has been brought in?
