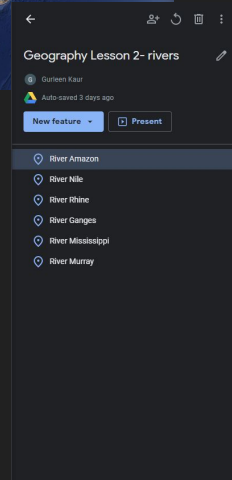

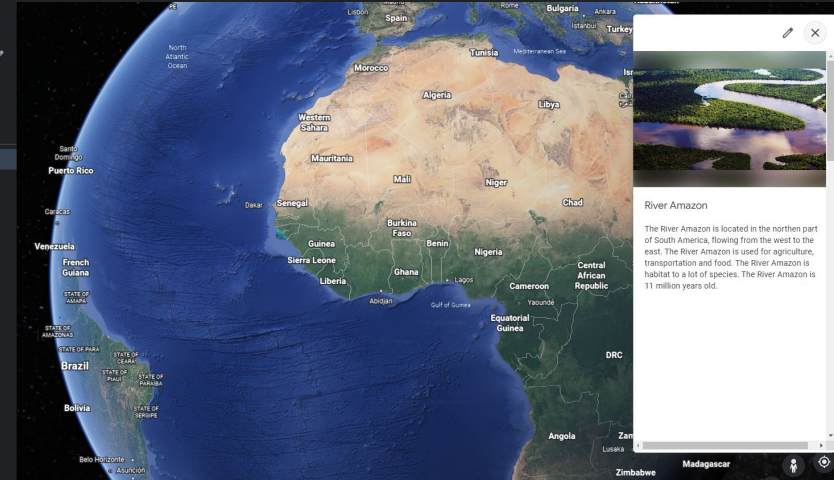


River Ganges

People say that wildlife watching is art - others say it hurts animals! Huge debate!



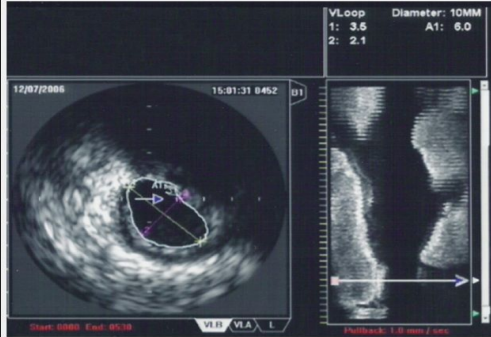
Pupils worked in pairs. One chromebook was used complete research and the other chromebook was used to make notes on google keeps to write notes.

Science

30 Hours

A zygote is developed in the first 30 hours of pregnancy. The egg is fertilized by the mother and a sperm in the father that also fertilizes it. The zygote is divided only once.

LQ: What is human gestation?

Date: Wednesday 2nd March 2022

Gestation Period - stages	What happens to the offspring during this stage?
30 hours	Zygote - it is divided once
5 weeks	Size of raisin - brain and spinal cord start to develop
6 weeks	Heartbeat - arms and legs form
8 weeks	Foetus - produces stomach and digestive juices - umbilical cord (goodness like nutrients and oxygen) goes through to baby
9 weeks	Fingerprints are formed - it can grip
12 weeks	3 months - fully developed child - needs to get bigger - not have bump yet - as big as adult thumb - weighs £1 coin - pregnancy signs: morning sickness, food cravings, changes of senses etc

6 weeks



At 6 weeks, you can hear the heartbeat of the baby. The heartbeat is estimated to form at 6 weeks as well but it can happen sooner or later. There should be 90-110 bpm (beats per minute) The legs and arms begin to form as well at this stage.

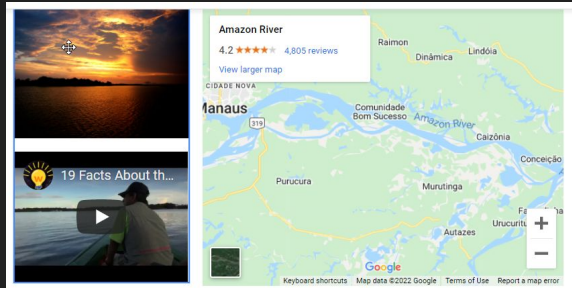


- Chromebooks were used to complete market research.

- The research collated was presented on google slides allowing them to come up with ideas for their cupcake design.

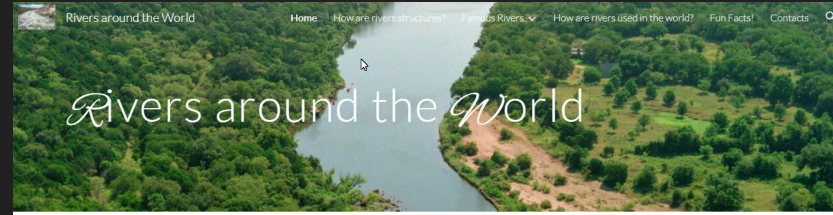

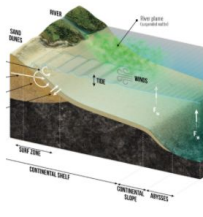
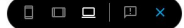
