

Roman Mosaics



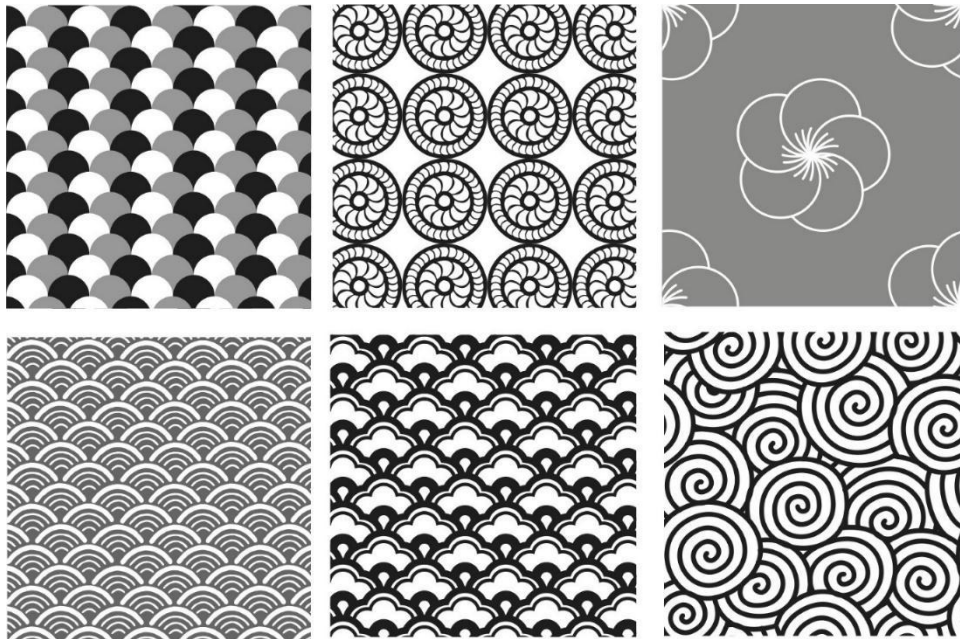
Mosaic- is a piece of art created by assembling small pieces of coloured glass, ceramic, stone, or other materials into an image. **Mosaics** became a very popular art form during the time of the **Roman Empire**.



Antoni Gaudí - a Catalan architect, whose distinctive style is characterized by freedom of form, voluptuous colour and texture.



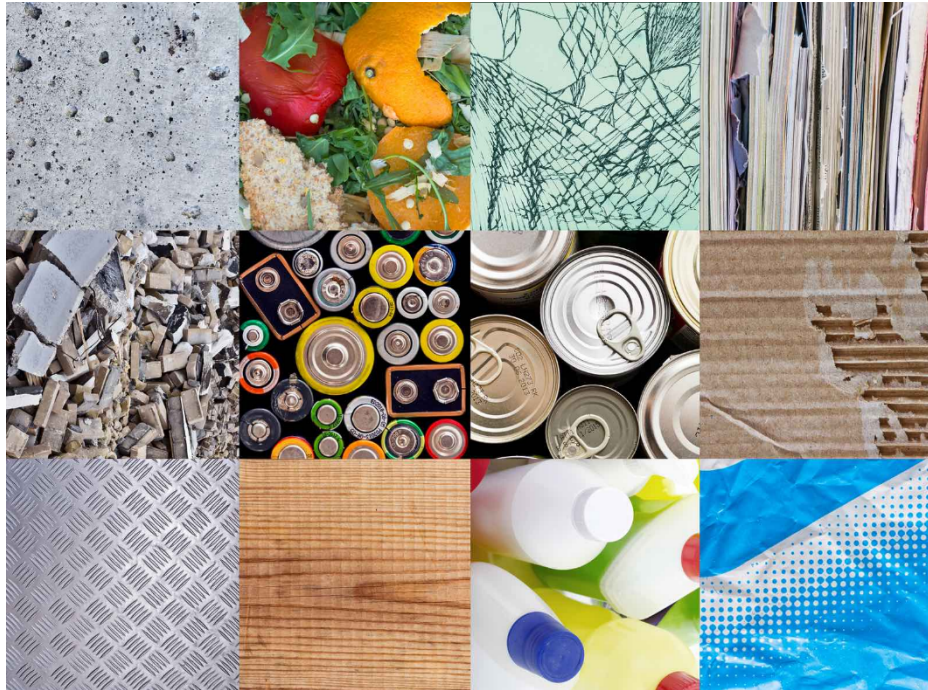
Mosaic Tiles- Traditionally, a **mosaic** is a decorative design or work of art made up of small materials (such as pieces of stone or glass) arranged to create a pattern or image



Pattern- a **pattern** is a design in which lines, shapes, forms or colours are repeated. The part that is **repeated** is called a motif. **Patterns** can be regular or irregular.



Shape patterns- occur when a group of **shapes** are repeated over and over again. These **patterns** follow a certain sequence, or order, of **shapes** that then repeated at two times.

Material- is any substance that has a name. For example: chalk, paper, wood, iron, air, water, clay, plastic, rubber, stone, leather, wax. Everything is made up of **materials**. The property of a **material** is something about it that we can measure, see or feel and helps us decide whether or not it is the best **material**.
