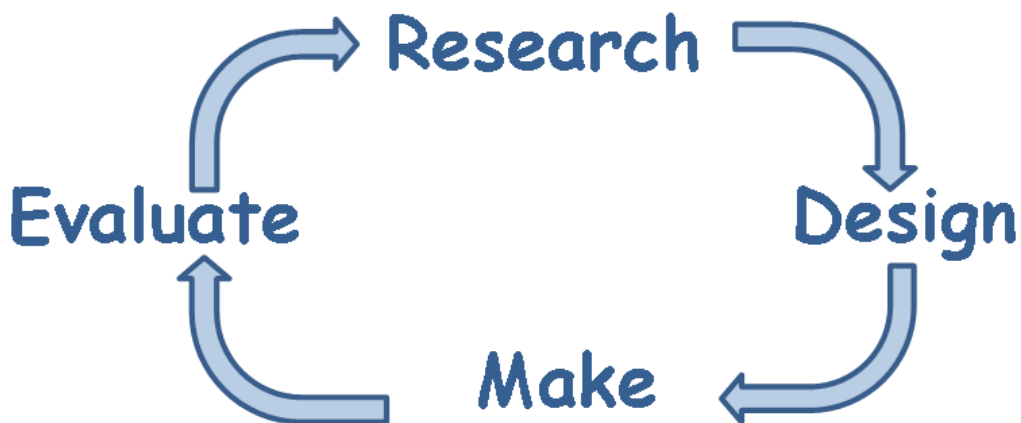

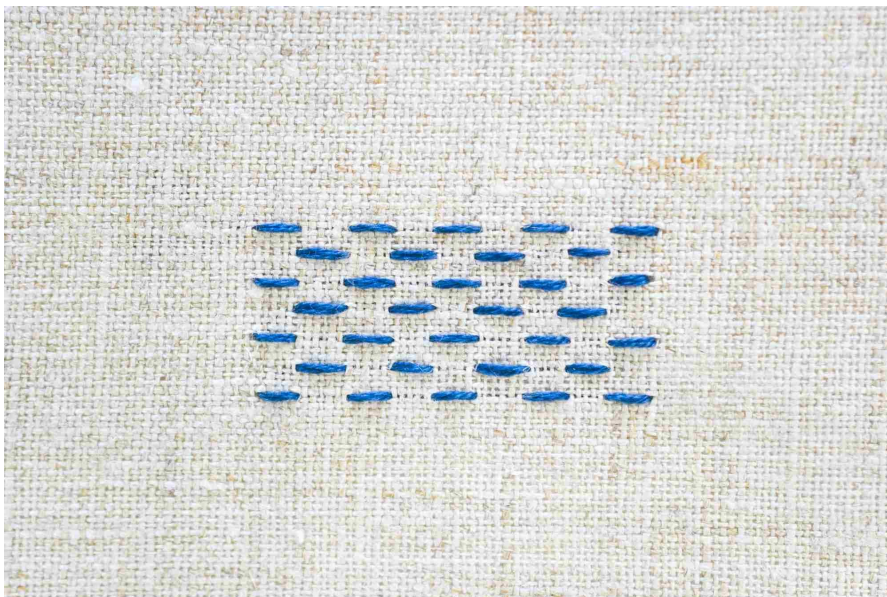

Design - a plan or drawing produced to show the look and function or workings of a building, garment, or other object before it is made.



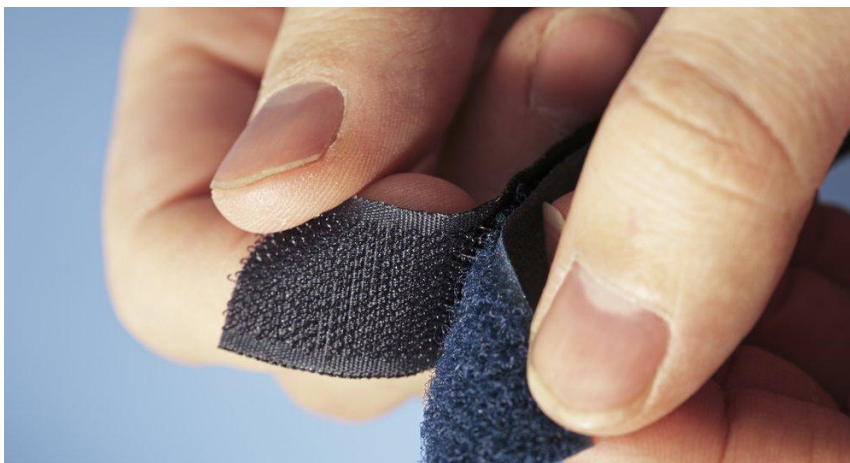
Cross stitch - a stitch formed of two stitches crossing each other. Traditionally, cross-stitch was used to embellish items like household linens, tablecloths, dishcloths, and doilies.

Velcro - a fastener for clothes or other items, consisting of two strips of thin plastic sheet, one covered with tiny loops and the other with tiny flexible hooks, which adhere when pressed together and can be separated when pulled apart



Felt - a kind of cloth made by rolling wool or another suitable textile accompanied by the application of moisture or heat, which causes the constituent fibres to mat together to create a smooth surface.



Fabric - a woven material, a textile or other material resembling woven cloth. Fabric is made up of yarns. Fabrics are made by the two main processes known as weaving and knitting.
