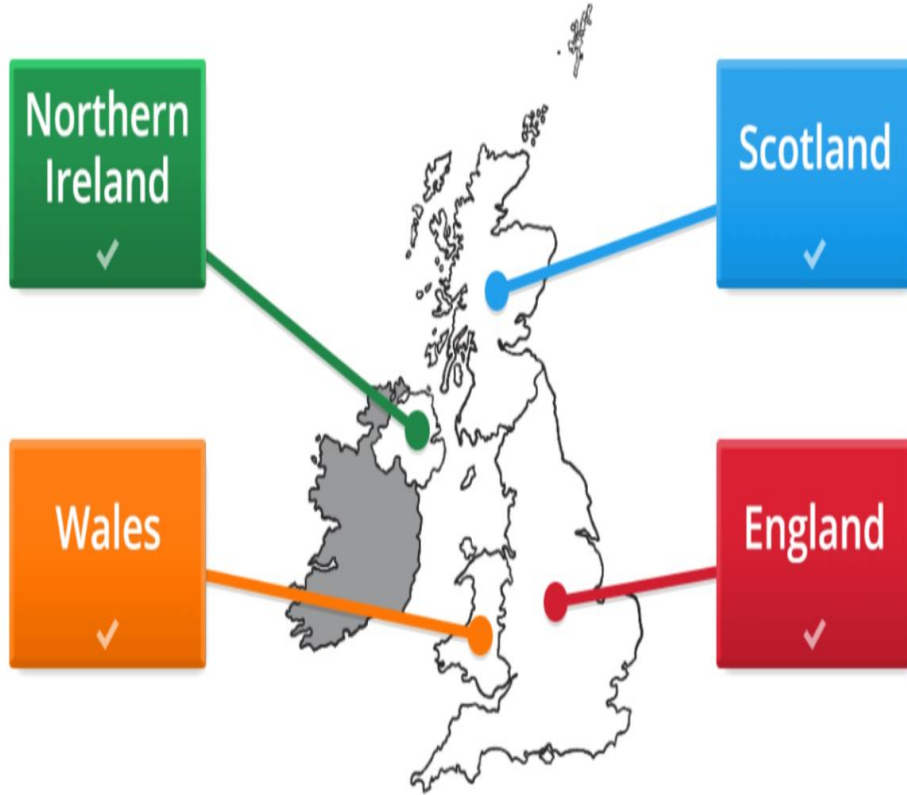


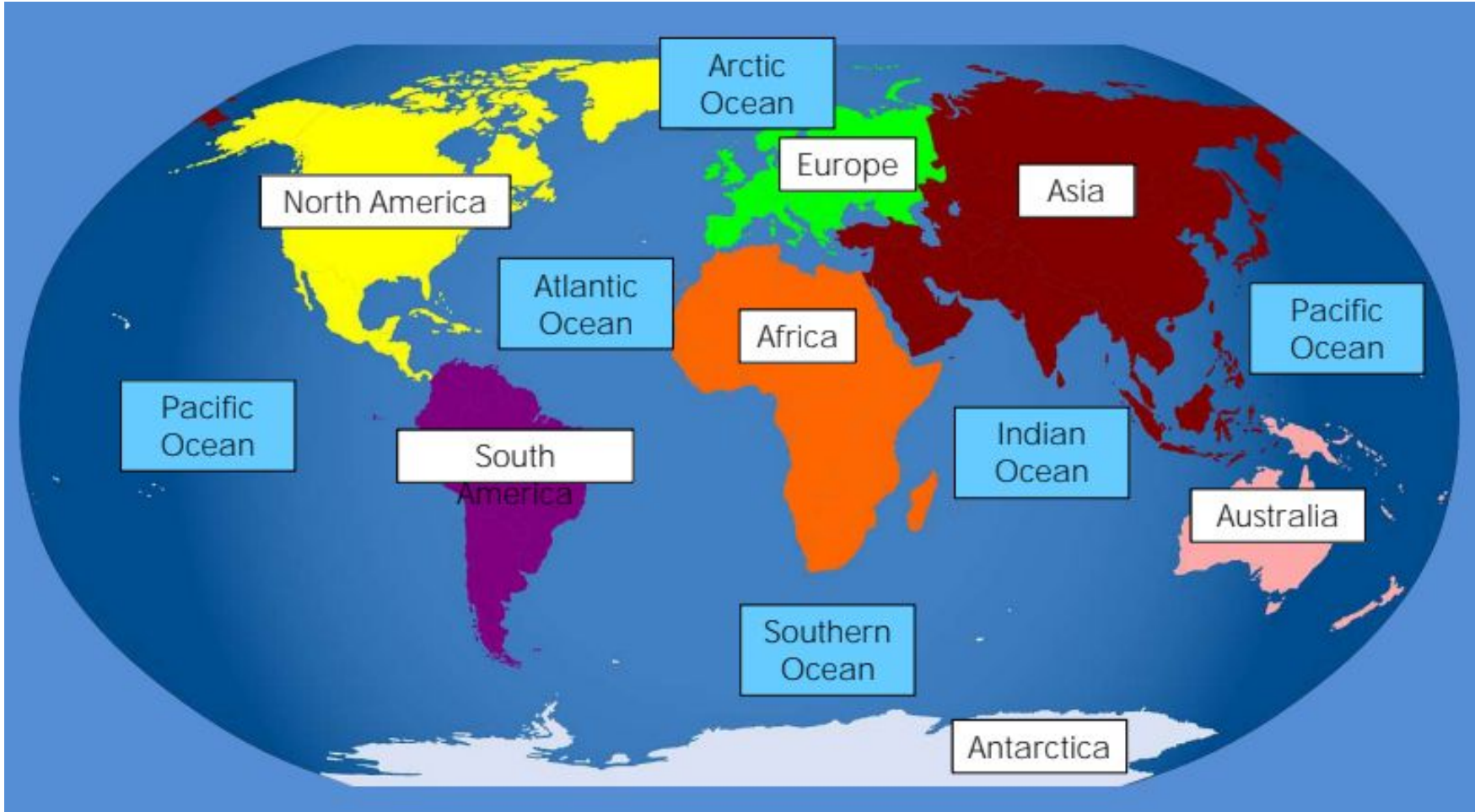

Names of the continents and the oceans:



Asia

Asia is the largest continent of our planet, both in size and also when we consider the population.



The Asian continent includes 49 countries, that are members of the United Nations. Asian countries are mainly located in the eastern Hemisphere and in the northern Hemisphere.

About 4.6 billion people live in Asia. The Asian continent has the most populous cities, which means there are the biggest cities in the world. Many million people live in the urban centres of the Asian continent, in cities such as in Delhi, Tokyo, Shanghai or Beijing.

Australia/Oceania

Australia is the smallest continent of the planet.



Oceania is in a continental group consisting of 14 countries and **includes Pacific islands and Australia**. Often Australia is named as continent, but this means that the many islands and countries except Australia would then be not included.

14 countries: Australia, Micronesia, Fiji, Kiribati, Marshall Islands, Nauru, New Zealand, Palau, Papua New Guinea, Samoa, Solomon Islands, Tonga, Tuvalu and Vanuatu.

About 43 million people live in Oceania. The most populous cities of the continent are Sydney, Melbourne, Brisbane and Perth - all these cities are in Australia.

Africa

Africa is the continent with the most countries. There are 54 countries on the African continent.



About 1.3 billion people live in Africa. The largest cities of the African continent are Lagos/Nigeria, Kinshasa/DR Congo and Cairo/Egypt.

The oldest human fossils such as skeletons and skulls have been discovered in Africa.

Africa also houses the longest river in the world, the Nile and the second highest waterfalls in the world, the Tugela Falls in South Africa.

North America

North America is a continent which is located entirely on the northern and western hemisphere.



There are 23 countries in total on the North American continent.

- the United States of America (USA)
- Canada
- Mexico
- the Caribbean islands
- and various other countries.

About 580 million people live on the North American continent. The Maya civilisation of Central America and Mexico is considered one of the oldest civilisations of this planet.

Europe

Europe is the second smallest continent in size but the third largest in population.



There are 50 countries in Europe with a total of more than 748 million people living on the continent in 2021.

The European continent is located completely in the northern hemisphere and mainly in the eastern hemisphere. Europe borders onto the Arctic Ocean in the North, the Atlantic Ocean in the west and the Mediterranean Sea in the South.

South America

South America is the fourth largest continent in size and the fifth largest when we consider population.



There are 12 countries in South America with a total of more than 433 million people living on the continent.

Largest Country: Brazil. The country is covering more than half the continent's landmass.

Longest River: Amazon River (6,437 km/ 4,000 miles). The Amazon is not only the second longest river in the world after the Nile, but also the Amazon carries more water than the world's other 10 biggest rivers combined!

Antarctica

Antarctica is the smallest continent by population numbers.



On Antarctica there are only research stations for scientists and no permanent settlements. Antarctica is covered almost completely by ice. 90% of the planet's ice is located on this continent, which also makes up 60% - 70% of the world's freshwater supply.
