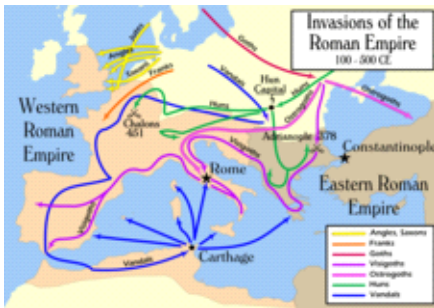


Romans: A person from the city of Rome, Italy, who lived during the Roman Empire.

Conquered: having been overcome and taken control of by military force (army).



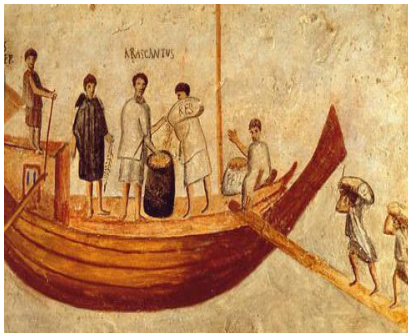
Settle: To move into a place to live/build a home or village.

class.



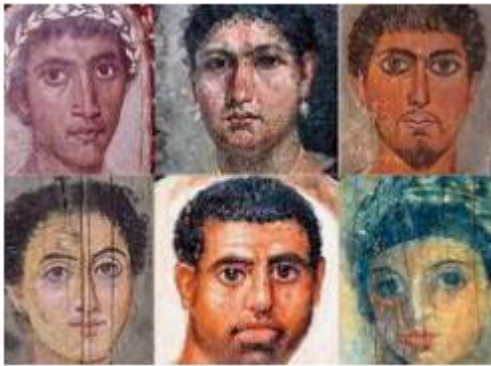
Patricians: were at the top of the Roman society.
