












<p>Monarchy</p>	<p>A nation or government ruled by or in the name of a king or queen.</p>	
<p>Hierarchy</p>	<p>A group of people graded according to rank or level of authority.</p>	
<p>Divorce</p>	<p>The ending of a marriage as recognized by law.</p>	
<p>Beheading</p>	<p>To cut off someone's head as an act of punishment.</p>	
<p>Ruff</p>	<p>A high, round, stiff collar worn by men and women.</p>	
<p>Wattle and daub</p>	<p>Building method used for making walls and buildings.</p>	

<p>Heir</p>	<p>A person who has the right to receive another person's property or title after that person's death.</p>	
<p>Catholicism</p>	<p>The faith and the practices of the Roman Catholic Church.</p>	
<p>Protestant</p>	<p>A Christian who belongs to a church other than the Catholic Church.</p>	
<p>Jousting</p>	<p>A fight between two knights on horseback. Each knight tries to knock the other off his horse with a lance.</p>	
<p>Obituary</p>	<p>A printed announcement of a person's death.</p>	
<p>Reformation</p>	<p>The religious movement of the sixteenth century that led to the establishment of the Protestant churches.</p>
