During this festival, people light up their houses and shops with Diyas, small cup-shaped oil lamp made of baked clay.



Eid ul Fitr is a Muslim holiday celebrated when Ramadan, the month of fasting, finishes. Muslims do not fast on Eid ul-Fitr as it is not allowed. When the new moon is seen after month of Ramadan, the next day is Eid ul-Fitr.
